The solar panel project is proceeding very smoothly and is on schedule. The project at Valencia High School should be completed by the end of Spring Break provided there are no unforeseen problems. It is estimated that the solar project will save the district approximately \$15 - 20 million over the 20 year contract with PsomasFMG, LLC.

Parking is still available during construction. In fact, in this first week of February there have been about 25 spots per day going unused. We are very grateful for parents, students, and teachers who have found various ways to help alleviate the parking problem. This short term inconvenience will lead to monetary gain for the district and help in a small way to improve our environment. We very much appreciate your patience.

College Visitation Field Trip

Sophomores and juniors with a 3.5 GPA or higher and other additional requirements are welcome to sign up for our college visitation to University of Southern California (USC). Trip visitation includes a scheduled campus tour and presentation. The USC trip will be on Wednesday, February 22nd from 7:45 am until approximately 3:30 pm. Limited spots are available. To sign up and/or receive more information, please visit the counseling office.

Students who meet the above criteria are also welcome to sign up for our college visitation to University of California, Santa Barbara. Trip visitation includes a scheduled campus tour and presentation. The UCSB will be on Friday, March 9th from 7:30 am until approximately 3:30 pm. Limited spots are available. Senior Financial Aid Information

Senior students heading to post-secondary education should have applied for, or be currently applying for, financial aid via the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) website at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Once the application is submitted, you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Review the SAR to make sure all the information is correct. The Expected Family Contribution (EFC) appears on the top of the SAR. The EFC is the amount of money that the federal government has determined that you and your family can contribute toward the cost of your child's college education. Eligibility for need-based aid is based on the difference between what the family can pay and the cost of attending the college or university. The EFC is calculated by a standard formula, applied to all financial aid applicants nationwide, and takes into consideration all of the information you provided on the FAFSA. Your EFC is the same for all colleges.

After the student's FAFSA has been submitted, seniors can be considered for a California Grant (Cal Grant). This year, ALL seniors were submitted for a Cal Grant electronically, so students do not need to apply individually or fill out any paperwork.

Individual college financial aid offices may request additional information from you, such as copies of your income tax returns. Always respond immediately to any requests from the college financial aid office, as financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and funds are limited. Do not send any of these additional documents unless the financial aid office requests them.

Once your child has been admitted to the college and has completed the financial aid process, the student may receive an offer of financial assistance, often called an "award letter" or "offer letter." This letter tells the student what he/she is eligible to receive in the form of grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study. The student must let the college know, usually within two weeks after he/she receives the award letter, whether the student is accepting or declining the award. Occasionally, the offer is negotiable with a financial aid officer at the college. Call the college's financial aid office if you want to discuss the award. If your financial circumstances have changed since you completed the FAFSA, let the financial aid officer at the college know. It could make a difference in the award offered. (NOTE: This information is adapted from EDUCAID-A Financial Aid Guide for High School seniors.)

COUNSELORS' CORNER

California Grant (Cal Grant)

After your student's FAFSA has been submitted, he/she can be considered for a California Grant (Cal Grant). This year, ALL seniors were submitted for a Cal Grant electronically, so students do not need to apply individually or fill out any paperwork. Information regarding the Cal Grants are found at <http://www.csac.ca.gov/doc.asp?id=105>. To find out the status of your Cal Grant, AFTER you have filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you can go online and check the status of your Cal Grant application by logging onto <https://mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov> and creating an account. This secure site will let you view the status of your Cal Grant application, update your address, view payment history or tell us you're changing your school.

2012 AP Exams

Students currently taking AP courses need to begin thinking about and preparing for the 2012 AP Exams. AP teachers will be distributing information and payment envelopes to their students in February regarding how to sign up and pay for the exams. Each AP exam will cost \$87, and payments will be accepted in the ASB office until March 2nd.

SAT Workshop

Valencia High School and The Princeton Review are offering an SAT Workshop on Saturday and Sunday, March 3rd and 4th at VHS. Designed as a basic introduction to the major principles tested on the SAT, this two-day program is ideal for those students who want to do a quick overview of the SAT before the March 10th SAT administration. In this workshop, students will learn valuable information about the SAT as well as some of the Princeton Review's famous strategic test-taking tips. In addition, students will take a practice SAT and receive The Princeton Review's famous Cracking the SAT book, complete with practice problems and test-taking strategies. Flyers with more information are available in the counseling office, and students must sign up before February 29th. This is an especially great workshop for junior students, as the March SAT exam date is the most popular date for junior students to begin their official SAT testing.

College Transcript Requests

Senior students who need their official high school transcripts mailed to any college(s) should visit the VHS registrar's office in person to fill out a transcript request form. Any request that is made in person with the correct form will be mailed within 24 hours to the requested college.

2012/2013 Course Selection

The VHS counselors will be meeting with all current 9th, 10th and 11th grade students during February and March to discuss and prepare course requests for the 2012/2013 school year. These students will be given a copy of the registration paper and will be asked to bring it home and discuss and fill it out with their parents/guardians.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING

Current juniors planning to apply to any four-year college or university next year are highly encouraged to take the March 10th, May 5th, and/or the June 2th administration of the SAT. For those taking the ACT instead of, or in addition to, the SAT, students should sign up for the ACT with the optional writing portion. The University of California System and many independent colleges may further require/recommend the SAT Subject Tests, as well. For test requirements of particular colleges and universities, please check the college website online, or contact the college or university directly. Applications for the SAT Reasoning Test, the SAT Subject Tests, and ACT are available **online**.

PRE-COLLEGE CHECKLIST

Seniors:

- * Submit Federal Student Aid Application (FAFSA) by mail or online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- * Apply for outside funding or scholarships. (Keep checking the "Scholarship" section of the VHS website on the counseling pages).
- * Send a thank you note to all those individuals who wrote a recommendation letter for you.

Juniors:

- * Start planning to take the SAT, ACT, and/or SAT Subject Tests, if necessary. (Check with all colleges you will be applying to and find out their specific testing requirements).
- * Begin browsing college websites or looking through college catalogs in the College/Career Center.

Sophomores:

- * Consider taking some of the SAT Subject Tests during June of this year. Since you may already be studying for finals in subjects like chemistry and world history, this is an excellent opportunity to try the SAT Subject Tests in the same subjects.

- Plagiarism prevention program used by thousands of institutions in over 80 countries, is a digital assessment suite. Students submit their papers 24 hours a day for review. The program instantly identifies papers containing unoriginal material.
- ### COMPUTER ACCESS
- The library has 24 computer workstations for student use before school, brunch, lunch, and after school. Students username is their 8 digit I.D. number and year of graduation. Password is their numerical birth date, 6 numbers the first time they log in. The password is then changed to a word chosen by student. If a student has log-in problems call 294-1188 ext. 305.

CALIFORNIA HIGH SCHOOL EXIT EXAM (CAHSEE)

The California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) is a graduation requirement which assesses skills on the California Content Standards for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. Students are required to pass both portions of the exam to receive a high school diploma. The goal is to ensure that students receiving a high school diploma can demonstrate grade-level competency in reading, writing, and mathematics. The CAHSEE is another indicator of educational performance in all California school districts and schools.

On March 13 and 14, the California High School Exit Exam will be given to all 10th graders, and all 11th and 12th graders that have not yet taken or passed both portions of the exam. Please try to have your students at school on March 13 and 14 to take the exam. They must bring #2 pencils and their ID cards. As always, students will have better results on exams if they have a balanced breakfast the day of the exam and have received a good night's sleep the night before an exam.

What Are Employers Looking for in Today's Workforce?

That question was answered recently when educators from the Hart School District and COC visited 14 large local businesses and learned about the current marketplace and hiring practices in the "Educators in Industry" event. Educators heard from employees in different positions and departments and learned about how their career paths evolved. Business leaders emphasized that to succeed in jobs today, soft skills are absolutely essential. These include: a strong work ethic, punctuality, enthusiasm for the job, a willingness to learn, teamwork, communication skills, electronic etiquette, problem-solving and collaboration skills. Employers said that applicants today are spending too much time texting and don't know how to type coherent cover letters and business emails.



Many applicants don't get past the first interview because their interviewing and communication skills are so poor. Having a four-year degree is no guarantee. Work experience and soft skills make the difference. Also, there are many jobs available for students with only two-year degrees or high school diplomas. In many positions, employees receive on-the-job training and may get funding for additional schooling.

To help evaluate themselves, teachers asked employees if their high school education prepared them for the workforce. Employees gave a mixed review. Some said their high schools prepared them for the workforce, others said they wish they had been taught soft skills and been challenged more in their classes. After the site visits, teachers met in small groups and discussed how to apply what they learned in their classes. They plan to add lessons on soft skills, especially writing and oral skills, teamwork, resume writing, and interviewing. They want to expose students to a more diverse range of career pathways and plan to bring in guest speakers and encourage students to do job shadows and internships.

Seventy-seven Hart District teachers and counselors who attended "Educators in Industry" plan to share what they learned with colleagues at upcoming department and faculty meetings.
